# Introduction

The West Clermont Instrumental Music Program includes Symphonic Band 1, Symphonic Band 2, Concert Band, Jazz Band, Percussion Ensemble, Color Guard, Winter Guard, Pep Band, and Marching Band.

The education philosophy of the West Clermont Instrumental Music Department is to educate every student enrolled in the program to the fullest extent. This includes skill development, cognitive understanding, and musical appreciation of fine music literature.

The primary objective of the West Clermont High School Band Program is to develop performance, rehearsal, and personal practice skills of each student. Students are expected to have a good work ethic, show consistent progress, and develop goals to achieve personal skills. Instrumentation for the marching band will be based on the concert band roster unless directed by the Director of Bands.

# Attendance Policy

**All rehearsals and performances are mandatory**. Attendance will be taken at all rehearsals and performances. Emailed excuses are required *prior* to an absence. Emails can be sent to Mr. Fischer.

A parent may be called to verify the student's absence. All working students should provide their employers with the summer and fall schedules, thus providing a means of eliminating schedule conflicts. Conflicts with other school organizations will be taken into consideration provided: A) The directors are informed in writing, by the student, at least one week in advance of the conflict; B) The student is in good standing according to the rules and regulations and grade requirements of the organization. *Attendance should be split evenly with both activities.* An unexcused absence from a rehearsal may result in the loss of position or suspension for the upcoming performance. Homework, projects, work, and driving classes are not excusable – *students must manage their time effectively*.

# Grading Policy

**Punctuality**- Punctual means being prepared with all materials at the specified call time. This does not include walking into the building or getting your instrument at the call time. Students who are not in their spots at the specified time will be considered late and will not receive the punctuality points for the event.

**Materials**- Are all items that are necessary to be successful. These things include a properly functioning instrument, dot books, music books, and other items required by directors.

**Participation**- This is defined as following the proper rehearsal procedures as well as completing assignments given.

# **Expectations**

- 1. Treat all members with mutual respect.
- 2. Be punctual and in your designated area at all times. Being "on time" in the West Clermont Band means **fifteen minutes prior** to the scheduled starting time.
- 3. Profanity/disrespect will not be tolerated at any time.
- 4. It is the responsibility of each member to have all equipment and other pertinent items at all rehearsals (drill books, music, pencils, etc.) Likewise, it is just as important to make sure **everything is put away and stored in its proper place after rehearsal.**
- 5. While at rehearsal you are expected to give 100% effort. Everyone will be working hard, just do it.

# Code of Conduct

A firm and fair policy of enforcement is necessary to uphold the regulations and standards of the West Clermont Music Department. The community, school administrators, and the music staff feel strongly that high standards of conduct and citizenship are essential in maintaining a sound program in music education. The welfare of the student is our major consideration and transcends any other consideration.

All band members shall abide by a Code of Conduct, which will earn them the honor and respect that participation in the Co-Curricular Music Program affords. Any conduct that results in dishonor to the musician, the Marching Band, or the school will not be tolerated. Acts of unacceptable conduct include but are not limited to: theft, vandalism, disrespect, immorality, or violations of the law. **Tarnishing the reputation of those associated with West Clermont High School and the Instrumental Music Program will not be tolerated**.

Students participating in the Marching Band must conduct themselves as mature young men and women. Participation in co-curricular programs is a privilege and not a right. Any band member whose conduct could be construed to reflect discredit upon the band and/or the school, will be subject to disciplinary action as determined by the music staff and/or administration. Issues of misconduct that are not directly stated within this document will be dealt with on an individual basis. This is an extension of the West Clermont High School Student Code of Conduct.

# Uniform Requirements

The following criteria have been established for achieving a clean and uniform look in our band. All uniform parts must be worn as instructed. When not performing, but still in uniform, all members may remove pieces of the uniform as per instructed by the directors. Required under-layers as specified are necessary at all times as there is no privacy when changing into uniforms. At competitions and football games, students may have to dress in public with limited privacy.

Prior to each performance, members must pass an inspection of their uniform and equipment. This ensures that the band maintains a cohesive, consistent appearance. In addition, we hope to foster good personal habits and pride in the band.

# Leadership Team

The Marching Band leadership team is then chosen by the directors, following an extensive process throughout April. Being a member of the leadership team is an opportunity for students to take on additional responsibilities that develop leadership skills. They are also the directors' eyes and ears of the band. Together, they work to make the band the best it can be.

If your student has a problem and does not know where to turn, or does not feel comfortable talking to the director, they could talk to a member of this group. That person will take the problem to the leadership team, who will suggest a solution or bring the problem to the director's attention for assistance in resolving the issue. Who knows - it could be that other students are having the same problem. This is also the group who knows what is going on and can be a source of information to your student. If you or your child have any questions or are not sure that the information heard through the grapevine is correct, ask one of the student leaders.

Charms is a Music Education Administrative Software that West Clermont Band uses for email communication, student data and the master band calendar. # **Financial Information**

There are fees associated with participating in the Marching Band.

#### West Clermont School District charges a Pay to Play fee of \$250.00 per student enrolled in Marching Band.

This fee will appear on the school fees bill at schedule pickup in the fall. This fee pays for a spot in the custom designed marching band show, transportation to competitions and parades, uniforms and costumes and other items. We urge you to pay this fee as early in the season as possible since nearly 100% of marching band activities are in the late summer/early fall. This fee is payable to West Clermont School District as early as 7/1 of each year. You can pay on your student's EZPay account or mail a check to the address below.

#### West Clermont Band Boosters charge a non-refundable fee of \$100.00 per student enrolled in Marching

**Band.** This fee pays for marching band staff, meals at band camp, clinicians, and other misc. items. New instrumentalists and all color guard members must purchase shoes at \$40.00. Instrumentalists shoes in good condition can be worn for multiple years. Color guard shoes may change from year to year. The non-refundable fee of \$100.00 and \$40.00 can be paid on the band website at <a href="http://wcwolvesband.com/shop/">http://wcwolvesband.com/shop/</a>. Fees will apply. # Volunteer Expectations

The Marching Band program provides students with the opportunity to grow and develop through an experience of shared learning that is truly unique. The program is like no other at West Clermont with about 200 students participating each year beginning in May with Mini-Band Camp and continuing through AAA Championships in November. The Directors work very hard and invest many hours, but there is simply no way the program can be what it is without the amazing support of parent volunteers. Through volunteering, parents create new friendships with other parents and have the unique opportunity to be involved with something that is such an important part of their students' high school experience. Parents/Guardians are expected to support the program by volunteering with the below minimum commitment:

1. We expect every parent to volunteer at a minimum of two events throughout the year - NOT including mandatory participation at Showcases, the WC Band Invitational, and MSBA Class AAA Championships. These competitions play a significant role in fundraising for the program and help cover some of the participation costs, lowering fees for all families.

2. In addition, to volunteer a minimum of six volunteer shifts (3-4 hours in length) throughout the season from May through November 2020. There are many ways to volunteer including:

- Help 'Feed the Band' by serving a meal provided by one of our sponsors during a rehearsal or before a game
- Help in the concessions stand during home football games
- Help during one of our fundraising events such as Yankee Candle, Bloom Spring Flowers, Mattress Fundraiser, etc.
- Serve as a Chaperone to help care for student health & well-being during rehearsals, camps, games, and competitions
- Volunteer to support the Pit Crew to create/support management of props and equipment
- Help with the uniform crew at a uniform fitting or by washing uniforms
- Etc, etc. etc. There are so many ways to volunteer, everyone can find a unique way they enjoy volunteering that fits your schedule
